





ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT REPORT

Introduction:

VSPM Academy of Higher Education Nagpur's Jawaharlal Nehru Arts, Commerce and Science College was established in the year 1990, in the vicinity of rural area of Wadi Nagar Parishad of District Nagpur in the state of Maharashtra. VSPM Academy of Higher Education Nagpur was established in 1971 with a vision to extirpate all social ills from the society. The academy has under his umbrella, around 54 educational institutions including Medical, Dental, Physiotherapy, Nursing, Arts, commerce, Science, Management, Education Colleges, Schools and Hospitals.

The college is spread over a lush green sprawling campus of 1.75 acres with build-up area of 4327.73 sq. meters. The college runs graduate courses in Arts, Commerce and Science stream whereas post graduate in Commerce stream. The under graduate courses are under grant-in-aid, while the post graduate course in Commerce is self-finance. The college is accredited by NAAC with 'B+' grade in the year 2019. In 2010, the UGC accorded the 2(f) and 12(B) status to the college. The college has been inclusive to accommodate socially backward and economically marginalized rural based students. Thus, the college has shown its concern and commitment for social justice, ensuring equity and expanding the access to higher education.

The college has mission to become a centre of quality education by promoting high academic and social pursuits and competencies of students for growth and development of rural population.

Major objectives of AAA:

1. To understand the existing system and assess the strengths and weaknesses of the Departments and Administrative Units and to suggest the methods for improvement and for overcoming the weaknesses.

2. To identify the bottlenecks in the existing administrative mechanisms and to identify the opportunities for academic reforms, administrative reforms and examination reforms etc.

3. To evaluate the optimum utilization of financial and other resources.

4. To suggest the methods for continuous improvement of quality keeping in mind criteria and reports by NAAC and other bodies.

Infrastructure:

The major plus point of this college is its well-established infrastructure, being supportive to curricular, extra-curricular and co-curricular activities on healthy lines. The college premises of modern structures housing the classrooms and laboratories, catering to the needs of more than 800 students. Classrooms are well-equipped with adequate furniture, LCD projector, interactive board/ white board/green board, lighting, ventilation and computer systems to help ICT enabled teaching learning.

The college has a central library with rich collection of books (print and electronic) to meet the changing demands of user community. To cope up with every expanding fields of knowledge, the library is sufficiently equipped with ICT facilities, useful software packages and congenial environment to impart innovative teaching-learning programmes.

Separate common rooms for girls with all the basic amenities, CCTV surveillance, canteen, yoga and meditation room, gymnasium, green gym, playground, R. O. plant and solar grid are the most essential features of the college campus.

Apart from this, the college has its own auditorium to conduct cultural and academic activities like expert talks, seminars, debate etc. The laboratories of the college are fully equipped with latest equipment as required in the curriculum. College has well-furnished computer lab with existing capacity of 50 computers. A digital language lab has been established with 29 computers and English language software.

Teaching -Learning:

The College has programmes to provide exposure to enhance the students learning experience by way of field trips, study tours, industrial visits, in-plant training and arranging departmental trips. In addition, guest lectures, motivational talks, memorial lectures, quiz and poster competitions are also arranged from time to time. In order to encourage the students to shape their future the college has made ample provisions for student support services like NSS, NCC, Competitive Examination Cell, Entrepreneurship Development Cell, CRT, Yoga and Meditation and sports. Due importance is given for the faculty enrichment and several need-based awareness programmes, trainings and workshops have been the integral part of the college academic activity. It is a matter of pride that this college is encouraging the faculty and students to publish their creative output through college magazine Srujan", Manuscript "Kalplata", students wall-paper "Zoopedia" and "English Knowledge Centre"

Special Features:

The college has demonstrated the credible social responsibility by organizing Health Check-up Camp& Eye Check Up Camp for local surrounding people of wadi. College has adopted Khadgaon village under NSS and organizing regular activity and special NSS Camp since last nine years.

Teaching faculty of J. N. College forms a strong backbone of teaching, learning, research, publication and over all academic development. Many of them have undertaken research activities and availed of minor research projects. Some of the faculty have been on various bodies of the Universities such as BOS, Senate, Management Council, Grievance Redressal Committee, Special Examination Committee, Standing Committee Member and Member of 32/5. All the faculty members are committed and working as a team to achieve the academic excellence. At the same, the Management of the college is overwhelmingly supportive to the progress of the college. The outstanding leadership of the Principal Dr. Sanjay S. Tekade definitely makes all the difference. His untiring efforts and vision are reflected in academic, administrative and infrastructural development of the college.

- Free access to internet.
- Books for entry in services has a direct link through the college website.
- Book bank facility for economically backward students.
- Book as on deposit scheme for the students at the time of examination.
- E-Resources has direct link to the college website.

Recommendations:

- Periodical information literacy programmes be conducted for the students to explicit the rich information resources (both print and electronic formats)
- Provision for "Media Room" may be made to enhance the proper use of "Open Educational Resources" available through Internet, YouTube, EMRC"s and public 24/7 channels like Vyaas, Ekalavyya.

Student Support Services
